Marilyn reported that Harriet Tubman's house in Auburn, NY, was recently designated as the latest national park in the system, joining the Tubman Underground Railroad, also part of the National Park System.

Eric John mentioned that Carden Wyckoff, twice an AWER speaker and noted UGA alumna, has been sworn in as a member of the Atlanta City Council to fill the unexpired term of Amir Farokhi, now Leader of the Galloway School.

President Victoria announced that District Governor Steve Ivory will be visiting and speaking at AWER's meeting at Georgia Tech on October 3. Victoria urged all AWER members to attend.
